Bloom's Questioning

<u>Remember</u>

- 1. How do the birds treat each other at the beginning of the film?
- 2. What was it that caught their attention?

Understand

1. What do you think the big bird wanted to do?

Apply

- 1. Has there been a time when you were treated differently by a group?
- 2. How did that experience make you feel?

<u>Analyse</u>

- 1. Why do you think the little birds treated the big bird differently?
- 2. What did they want to achieve by pecking at the big bird's feet?
- 3. Was it a good idea to peck at the big bird's feet? Why/Why not?

Evaluate

- 1. What do you think the message of the film is?
- 2. How would you react if you saw someone being treated unfairly?

Create

 Can you think of four different situations where someone might join a new group?

Suggested Activities

- 1. Design an anti-bullying poster with a catchy slogan and message.
- 2. Create your own unique bird and use up-levelled adjectives to describe its appearance and personalities.
- 3. This film has no speech write a script to share what you think the birds might be saying throughout the short film.
- 4. Investigate why birds do not electrocute themselves when sitting on electricity pylons.
